



Which pushchair is right for you?

You can't wait to proudly show off your baby in their own set of wheels but there are a few things for you to consider before you choose your pushchair. Check out these handy tips from Adeline Smith, Maxi-Cosi UK Marketing Manager and mum of two.

Consider your lifestyle

Did you know that during your baby's first year, you will walk an average of 600 miles? So it's really important to choose a good quality pushchair that

will not let you down. You

also need to consider your lifestyle and how you are going to use your pushchair: Do you live in a city flat with lots of stairs? Do you travel by car or public transport?



City compact or all-terrain?

Pushchairs with large wheels are great for off-road walks. In town life is best navigated in a more compact pushchair with smaller wheels to manoeuvre around the crowds. If you use public transport frequently, you will need to lift your pushchair quite often, so a compact lightweight pushchair is your best choice.

Some pushchairs even stay upright once folded which is ideal to store out of way in the bus/train. Check to make sure that your dream pushchair will fit in your car boot too.



Make it easy for yourself

A pushchair is an item you will use probably almost everyday, so it has to be practical for you. A quick and easy folding pushchair will save you loads of stress while shopping. A height-adjustable handle means that the pushchair can suit you and your partner. For your child's comfort, check that your pushchair has a soft padded seat with a lie-flat position, this is especially important for your newborn baby. Young babies like face to face interaction so go for a pushchair with a parent/forward facing seat.



Which accessories do you need?

Besides the sun canopy and raincover that are often included you might want to go for a footmuff to keep your baby snug in the winter, a carrycot to protect your newborn baby from the cold and wind and a changing bag which can all be colour matched to your pushchair.
